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How to install Amicus Version V in a terminal service environment

First off, I am going to assume that you know something about Terminal Services.

Before we start there are some considerations to take place:

1. Is your server also the domain controller?

If so, you need to make sure that users can Log on Locally. If you do not know how to do this you can checkout this article: http://www.petri.co.il/logon_locally_user_right.htm.

2. You are not installing Amicus Attorney for the same user on the terminal server and on the workstation

Attorney Craig Bayer cannot have Amicus installed for him on the Terminal Server and on his desktop computer. This will cause a crap load of problems.

Installation Checklist

READ EVERY FREAKIN STEP AND THEN TRY IT

1. Setup the users in Active Directory. They must be setup not only as Terminal Service users but also add them to the Administrators Group. You can remove them from Administrators Group when the installation is complete.
2. You need to setup a personal folder for each user that you are installing Amicus for. I usually create a Folder called Terminal Services and then in it, a Bayer, Craig folder, a Lee, Meagan folder and so on.

3. Logon as the first user you want to install Amicus for. In our case it will be Craig Bayer.
4. Go to Start → Control Panel → Add or Remove Programs. You need to browse to Team 50 → Install and run the setup.exe
5. When it asks you for the installation path, I am going to use the Bayer, Craig folder that I created.
6. Once the installation is complete, logon to Amicus. If it loads up, you can click Finish on the Add Programs dialogue.
7. MOVE the aa50.ini located in the WINNT or Windows folder to the users folder created by Windows. THIS IS NOT THE FOLDER YOU CREATED. The path should be something like this:
Documents and Settings\Craig Bayer\Windows
8. Log off Craig Bayer, Remove Craig Bayer from the Administrators Group and repeat Steps 3 – 7 to add more users.
